SHORT SAFARI PROGRAM

The Exclusive Flying Explorer takes you first to the Kidepo Valley National Park. The park is approximately 520 kilometers northeast of Kampala, Uganda's capital, so getting there requires a 10 to 12-hour drive by road. The park's altitude ranges from 914 to 2,750 meters above sea level, with the peak of Mount Morungole being the highest point. Kidepo Valley National Park is consistently rated one of the best in Africa due to its open or lightly wooded Serengeti-style savannah teeming with wildlife, interspersed with rocky ridges, and seasonal rivers lined with borrassus palms. The park shares its name with the Kidepo River, which flows from the neighboring Kidepo Game Reserve in South Sudan through the Narus Valley, stretching across the border. It facilitates a fantastic diversity of wildlife that includes the greater and lesser kudu and the eland. Big cats roaming the park include lion, leopard, cheetah, spotted hyena, and blackbacked jackals, and other species that you can observe are elephant, Rothschild's giraffe, Burchell's zebra, cape buffalo, and Jackson's hartebeest. At the center of the wildlife attractions in the park is one of the largest cohesive groups of buffalos, counting more than 2,000 animals.

The second part of your safari takes you to the Murchison Falls National Park. Situated along the River Nile and in part on the shores of Lake Albert, it covers more than 3,900 square kilometers of land-scapes dominated by savannahs dotted with acacia trees in the north and sub-tropical lowland forests, interspersed with riverine woodlands in the south. The park is named after the famous falls on the Nile River and features a 43-meter fall of boiling white water, which is forced through a 7-meter wide gap in a rocky escarpment before crashing into the lightly wooded savannah below. Murchison Falls NP is home to an extraordinary variety of wildlife, including buffalos, lions, elephants, and Rothschild's giraffe, with chimpanzees in the Budongo forest reserve. Another adventure not to miss is daily scheduled boat cruises departing from various locations along the Nile. One goes upstream to visit the falls, and another goes down the

river into the Nile Delta, a papyrus swamp ecosystem that developed at the Nile and Lake Albert meeting point. Here, you can observe an abundance of hippos, elephants, and crocodiles. The delta is also home to various tropical birds, including Uganda's most famous and elusive bird, the shoebill stork.

The third part of your safari takes you to the Queen Elizabeth National Park. The park is home to an amazing variety of wildlife, such as elephants, buffalos, hippos, chimps, many antelope species, and the Rothschild's giraffe. It features altogether more than 90 species of mammals and 20 species of carnivores, such as the lion, leopards, side-stripped jackal, and spotted hyena, and is also considered a birder's paradise with 600 tropical bird species identified to date. The parkland covers 1,978 square kilometers of vistas ranging from Lake Edward and Lake George near the crater-dotted Katwe region and below the Rwenzori Mountains in the north to the rolling golden savannahs of the Ishasha sector and its tree-climbing lions in the south. Tracking the tree-climbing lions of the Ishasha sector is another objective you should achieve during your visit to this national park. Tree-climbing lions exist in substantial numbers only in a few places on the continent. Driving across the rolling savannah of Ishasha, you can observe lions climbing into Acacia trees to find the best branch to sleep on in the daytime. This means you may find a dozen lions clambering up the same tree, sometimes fighting each other for the biggest branch to sleep on.

The next part of your safari takes you to the ancient Bwindi Forest, an important UNESCO World Heritage Site and Uganda's most famous national park due to the large population of endangered mountain gorillas living in the bamboo forests of its interior. The park is comparatively small, occupying about 330 square kilometers of montane and lowland forests that can be accessed only on hiking trails established at main park entry points linked to the four sectors of the forest, Rushaga, Buhoma, Nkuringo, and Ruhija. Of the close to 1,000 mountain gorillas in this region, about 470 reside in the ancient Bwindi Forest, dating back to the last ice age and providing the backdrop for the 'Bucket List' adventure of tracking mountain

gorillas in their natural habitat of dense bamboo thickets with enchanting views of tropical rainforests.

The last part of your safari takes you to the Mgahinga Gorilla National Park, which is situated in southwestern Uganda, bordering Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), and was gazetted as such in 1991. It is the smallest of the ten parks the country has established, covers just 33 square kilometers, and is part of the Virunga Conservation Area (VCA). The 434 square kilometers of the VCA also includes a string of eight volcanoes situated on the edge of the Albertine Rift Valley and stretching across the borders of the three adjacent countries. The Mgahinga NP has an altitude range of 2,227 to 4,127 meters and was created primarily to protect the endangered mountain gorillas that inhabit the slopes of its dense bamboo forests, but it is also an important habitat for the rare golden monkeys. The park has just one habituated transboundary gorilla family, which is difficult to track as it constantly crosses borders into Rwanda and the DRC. The Mgahinga NP is often visited to see the equally endangered golden monkeys or to venture on an exhilarating climb of the forested slopes of three of the eight extinct volcanoes that make up the Virunga Volcanoes range.



Arriving in Uganda, your appointed driver/guide will transfer you from Entebbe International Airport to your accommodation. Then, you will receive a briefing on your upcoming tour.

☐ Day 02 - Entebbe to Kidepo Valley National Park.

Today, your appointed driver/guide will take you to the Entebbe International Airport for a scheduled charter flight to the Kidepo Valley National Park in the north of Uganda. After checking into your 5-star accommodation, you will go on your first extensive *Game Drive* in the Kidepo Valley National Park. The Kidepo Valley National Park was established in 1962 and covers an area of 1,442 square kilometers in the far northeast corner of Uganda, bordering Kenya and South Sudan. The park is approximately 520 kilometers northeast of Kampala, Uganda's capital, so getting there requires a 10 to 12-hour drive by road. The park's altitude ranges from 914 to 2,750 meters above sea level, with the peak of Mount Morungole being the highest point.

Kidepo Valley National Park is consistently rated one of the best in Africa due to its open or lightly wooded Serengeti-style savannah teeming with wildlife, interspersed with rocky ridges, and seasonal rivers lined with borrassus palms. The park shares its name with the Kidepo River, which flows from the neighboring Kidepo Game Reserve in South Sudan through the Narus Valley, stretching across the border. It facilitates a fantastic diversity of wildlife that includes the greater and lesser kudu and the eland. Kidepo Valley NP also features a spectacular collection of African birds, with more than 480 species identified to date, including ostriches in the northern part of the park and 56 birds of prey. On the cultural side, the park is in the heart of the Karamoja tribespeople,







and visiting their villages is a must-see. There is the additional chance also to visit the Ik mountain tribe, which are hunter/gatherers and originally migrated to these lands from Ethiopia. Today, they live in their mountain villages on the higher elevations of the Morungole Mountains, on the border to Kenya, and only count about 10,000.

Activity Option - Explore Karamojong Manyatta - US \$ 120 Per Person

The Karamojong tribal clans of northern Uganda are a famous warrior tribe that lives in the border triangle between Uganda, Kenya, and South Sudan. Visiting a Karamojong 'Manyatta', a collective village, is a must-do experience as it allows you to encounter their ancient cultures and traditions.

Activity Option - Explore Ik Mountain Tribe - US \$ 150 Per Person

Visiting the Ik tribe requires an early morning departure to explore their remote mountain villages. The Ik tribe is hunter-gatherers who originally migrated to this area from Ethiopia. Today, they live in their mountain villages on the higher elevations of the Morungole Mountains, on the border to Kenya, and there are only about 10,000 of them today. Visits to the Ik tribe offer the discerning visitor rare cultural encounters complemented by extraordinary mountain views. However, the steep climb to reach the Ik villages is not easy and may take all day. You must be physically fit since the main trail to the Ik village is 8 kilometers each way and can be a challenging climb.



☐ Day 05 - Entebbe to Murchison Falls National Park.

Today you transfer to the Murchison Falls National Park, where you will go on an *Game Drive* at the park. Located in the northwest of Uganda, at about 300 kilometers or 4-hour drive from the capital, Kampala, Murchison Falls National Park is the most popular park in the country, with the highest annual number of visitors of any park. Locally known as Kabalega National Park, it was established by the British colonial administration in 1952 and is today the largest gazetted park in Uganda. Situated along the River Nile and in part on

the shores of Lake Albert, it covers more than 3,900 square kilometers of landscapes dominated by savannahs dotted with acacia trees in the north and sub-tropical lowland forests, interspersed with riverine woodlands in the south.

The park is named after the famous falls on the Nile River and features a 43-meter fall of boiling white water, which is forced through a 7-meter wide gap in a rocky escarpment before crashing into the lightly wooded savannah below. Today, there is a hiking trail starting at 'Baker's Point' at the bottom of the falls, which marks the spot where the famous explorer, while standing on a giant rock, declared in 1864 that the falls be named after geologist Sir Roderick Murchison, who was the president of the British Royal Geographical Society at that time.

Murchison Falls NP is home to an extraordinary variety of wildlife, including buffalos, lions, elephants, and Rothschild's giraffe, with chimpanzees in the Budongo forest reserve. The park can also be considered a birder's paradise, with more than 450 bird species documented to date, including the rare shoebill stork, the great blue turaco, Ross turaco, dwarf kingfisher, Goliath heron, and white-thighed hornbill.

The larger Murchison Falls Conservation Area (MFCA) also includes the Budongo Forest Reserve in the southern sector of the national park. The forest reserve is one of the most ecologically diverse in East Africa, with 76 species of mammals and over 465 plant species recorded, including a dense area of giant mahogany trees, some over 60 meters tall. The forest is also home to a population of primates such as chimp troops, the blue and red-tailed, and the black-and-white colobus monkeys.

Another adventure not to miss is daily scheduled boat cruises departing from various locations along the Nile. One goes upstream to visit the falls, and another goes down the river into the Nile Delta, a papyrus swamp ecosystem that developed at the Nile and Lake Albert meeting point. Here, you can observe an abundance of

hippos, elephants, and crocodiles. The delta is also home to various tropical birds, including Uganda's most famous and elusive bird, the shoebill stork.



Day 07 - Murchison Falls NP to Queen Elizabeth National Park. Today, you transfer to the Queen Elizabeth National Park, where you will go on a Game Drive upon arrival. 'Queen E', as it is commonly called, is the second most popular national park in Uganda, next to Murchison Falls NP. It was initially gazetted as the Kazinga NP in 1952 but renamed Queen Elizabeth National Park just two years later to commemorate a visit by England's Queen. The park is home to an amazing variety of wildlife, such as elephants, buffalos, hippos, chimps, many antelope species, and the Rothschild's giraffe. It features altogether more than 90 species of mammals and 20 species of carnivores, such as the lion, leopards, side-stripped jackal, and spotted hyena, and is also considered a birder's paradise with 600 tropical bird species identified to date. The parkland covers 1,978 square kilometers of vistas ranging from Lake Edward and Lake George near the crater-dotted Katwe region and below the Rwenzori Mountains in the north to the rolling golden savannahs of the Ishasha sector and its tree-climbing lions in the south.

Of these landscapes, four have become famous for offering unique experiences. First, there are the volcanic cones and crater lakes found around Katwe, Fort George, and Kasenyi on the west side of the Kazinga Channel, which formed as a result of volcanic activity along the Albertine Rift Valley and are used today by local communities to extract salt. Next on the 'not to miss' list is the Kazinga channel itself, a 32 km long natural canal linking Lake Edward and Lake George, and known for its substantial population of hippos. Exploring the channel during a boat cruise allows you to say hello to the 'Hippo Nation' and observe many of the 600 tropical bird species recorded in this national park, including the rare and elusive 'Shoebill Stork'.


Another item on your 'must-see list' for 'Queen E' is the Kyambura Gorge, situated on the Mweya peninsula and known as the 'Valley of the Apes'. Activity Option - Katwe Craters And Salt Works - US \$ 80 Per Person

Explore the volcanic cones and crater lakes of Katwe, Fort George, and Kasenyi on the west side of the Kazinga Channel. These lakes formed as a result of volcanic activity along the Albertine Rift Valley and are used today by local communities to extract salt. Here, you can meet and observe local villagers who spend their days under the equatorial sun, working the network of paths and milky salt pans that crisscross the plains of the Katwe peninsula.

Activity Option - Chimp Tracking Kyambura - US \$ 100 Per Person

Visit the Kyambura Gorge on the Mweya peninsula, also known as the 'Valley of the Apes'. The gorge was formed thousands of years ago by the flow of the Kyambura River. It is about 1 km across and 100 meters deep and is also home to troops of our closest relatives, the chimps. A nature walk through the gorge is one of the highlights of your safari as it allows you to observe the chimp troops in their natural habitat of lowland riverine forest.

Activity Option - Balloon Safari - US \$ 380 Per Person

Today, you will go on a scenic charter flight to the Bwindi Impenetrable National Park, which is situated in southwestern Uganda, was first established as a Crown Forest Reserve in 1932, and gazetted as a national park in 1991. The ancient Bwindi Forest is an important UNESCO World Heritage Site and is Uganda's most famous national park due to the large population of endangered mountain gorillas living in the bamboo forests of its interior. The park is comparatively small, occupying about 330 square kilometers of montane and lowland forests that can be accessed only on hiking trails established at main park entry points linked to the four sectors of the forest, Rushaga, Buhoma, Nkuringo, and Ruhija.

Of the close to 1,000 mountain gorillas in this region, about 470 reside in the ancient Bwindi Forest, dating back to the last ice age and providing the backdrop for the 'Bucket List' adventure of track-







ing mountain gorillas in their natural habitat of dense bamboo thickets with enchanting views of tropical rainforests. The remaining African mountain gorillas are in three other locations: the Mgahinga Gorilla National Park in Uganda, the Volcanoes National Park in Rwanda, and the Virunga National Park in the DRC. These three national parks and eight volcanoes situated along the Albertine Rift Valley are known as the Virunga Conservation Area (VCA).

In addition to the famous mountain gorillas, the park features an astonishing variety of flora and fauna, including 120 species of mammals, of which 10 are primates, 350 species of birds, 310 species of butterflies, 27 species of chameleons, geckos, and frogs. The forest is among the most ecologically diverse in East Africa, with more than 1,000 flowering plant species, 200 species of trees, and 104 species of ferns. You also have the opportunity to observe other primates, such as chimps, black and white Colobus monkeys, and L'Hoest monkeys.

Activity Option - Gorilla Habituation Exp.- US \$ 1,500 Per Person

Two types of gorilla tracking permits are available in the ancient Bwindi Forest. The standard permit costs US \$ 800 per person, allowing a larger group of 8 to visit a habituated gorilla family for 1 to 2 hours. The longer and more exclusive gorilla habituation experience costs US \$ 1,500 per person and allows a smaller group of 4 to join researchers during their visit to one of the gorilla families habituated to human presence for 4 hours.

Activity Option - Explore Batwa Cultural Trail - US \$ 80 Per Person

The Batwa Forest People are an ethnic group with rich and ancient ancestral traditions and rely on the forest, hunting and harvesting wild yams and honey without adversely affecting the area's ecosystem. Exploring the 'Batwa Trail' allows you to join their guides and venture along extensive forest trails to learn about their cultures,

traditions, and techniques of surviving in the forest. You will also visit their villages in the forest to observe musical performances and traditional hunting/gathering demonstrations.

Day 11 - Bwindi Impenetrable NP to Mgahinga Gorilla NP.

Today, you transfer to the Mgahinga Gorilla National Park with the opportunity to venture into the dense bamboo forests for *Golden Monkey Tracking*, which are considered the smallest primate species and endangered.

The Mgahinga Gorilla National Park is situated in southwestern Uganda, bordering Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), and was gazetted as such in 1991. It is the smallest of the ten parks the country has established, covers just 33 square kilometers, and is part of the Virunga Conservation Area (VCA). This regional management association includes the Mgahinga Gorilla National Park in Uganda, the Volcanoes National Park in Rwanda, and the Virunga National Park in the DRC. The 434 square kilometers of the VCA also includes a string of volcanoes situated on the edge of the Albertine Rift Valley and Mgahinga NP features three of the eight volcanoes that make up the famous Virunga Volcanoes range, namely, Mt. Muhabura (4,127 m), Mt. Gahinga (3,474 m), and Mt. Sabinyo (3,645 m).

The Mgahinga NP has an altitude range of 2,227 to 4,127 meters and was created primarily to protect the endangered mountain gorillas that inhabit the slopes of its dense bamboo forests, but it is also an important habitat for the rare golden monkeys. The park has just one habituated transboundary gorilla family, which is difficult to track as it constantly crosses borders into Rwanda and the DRC. By comparison, the Bwindi Impenetrable NP features 18 habituated gorilla families, so completing your bucket list is practically guaranteed. The Mgahinga NP is often visited to see the equally endangered golden monkeys or to venture on an exhilarating climb of the forested slopes of three of the eight extinct volcanoes that make up the Virunga Volcanoes range.

Of the three volcanoes within the park boundaries, Mount Muhabura (4,127 m) is the second highest in the volcano range and is situated on the border between Rwanda and Uganda. Climbing its peak rewards you with fantastic views of at least five other volcanoes in

the border triangle. The climb is considered demanding and may take a whole day to achieve. Climbing Mount Sabinyo (3,645 m) can also be challenging, so it is advisable to be fit for a long climbing session. By comparison, Mount Gahinga (3,474 m) is the smallest of the three volcanoes and the easiest and fastest to climb.

Activity Option - Golden Monkey Tracking - US \$ 60 Per Person

Trekking the forest trails and slopes of Mgahinga Gorilla NP or any other part of the Virunga Conservation Area allows you to observe the rare golden monkeys, the smallest of the primates and an endangered species. The golden monkey is a subspecies of the blue monkey, with a golden patch on the upper flanks and back. It is at home in the same bamboo forests, which are preferred as the primary diet by the mountain gorillas.

Activity Option - Explore Batwa Cultural Trail - US \$ 80 Per Person

The Batwa Forest People are an ethnic group with rich and ancient ancestral traditions and rely on the forest, hunting and harvesting wild yams and honey without adversely affecting the area's ecosystem. Exploring the 'Batwa Trail' allows you to join their guides and venture along extensive forest trails to learn about their cultures, traditions, and techniques of surviving in the forest. You will also visit their villages in the forest to observe musical performances and traditional hunting/gathering demonstrations.

Activity Option - Volcano Trekking - US \$ 100 Per Person

Trekking volcanoes is the other primary reason to visit the park. You can venture to climb one of the three Virunga volcanoes situated in the park or straddle the border with Uganda. Climbing any of these volcanoes varies in degrees of difficulty or time to achieve.

Mount Muhabura: This volcano is 4,127 meters high and the second highest in the Virunga range. Climbing its peak rewards you with fantastic views of at least five of the other volcanoes in the border triangle. The climb itself is considered demanding and may take a full day to achieve.

Mount Sabinyo: This volcano is 3,645 meters high, and climbing its peak may take 8 hours to achieve and can be demanding; it is, therefore, advisable to be fit for a long climbing session.

Mount Gahinga: This volcano is 3,474 meters high, the smallest of the three, and the easiest and fastest to climb. It once had a crater lake at the center of its caldera, which degraded into a montane moorland.
