



12 DAYS - THE MOUNTAINS OF THE MOON EXPLORER

SHORT SAFARI PROGRAM

The Mountains of the Moon Explorer takes you on a once-in-a-life-time climbing adventure of this mythical mountain range in western Uganda. The Rwenzori Mountains National Park was gazetted as such by the government of Uganda in 1991 and has been listed as an important UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1994. Covering almost 1,000 square kilometers over its entire length of 220 kilometers, the mythical Mountains of the Moon are higher than the Alps and feature the third highest mountain in Africa, Margherita Peak on Mount Stanley, with a height of 5,109 meters. Located in southwestern Uganda along the border with the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), and with 70 percent of its area above an altitude of 2,500 meters, Africa's fourth and fifth-highest peaks (Mount Speke and Mount Baker) can also be found in the Rwenzori mountains.

In principle, the mountain range facilitates five vegetation zones, from grasslands in the foothills, montane and bamboo forests, and a heather zone on the lower elevations, with a moorland zone just below the snowfields and glaciers of the higher elevations. The flora of the moorland zone alone, fringed with swamps and rivers, is unique to alpine regions where some of the montane plant species, such as lobelia and groundsel, grow extraordinarily large, providing for surreal landscapes and 'out of this world' hiking experiences.

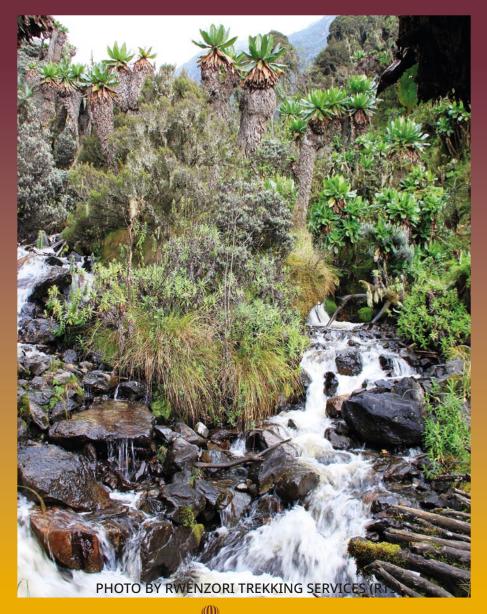
☐ Day 02 - Entebbe to Kasese.

Today, your driver/guide will collect you from your hotel and take you on a scenic drive to Kasese, situated in southwestern Uganda on the border to the DRC and just below the Rwenzori Mountains National Park (RMNP). On arrival, you will be met by representatives and Mountain Guides of the Rwenzori Trekking Service (RTS) for a briefing on your upcoming climb of the Rwenzori Mountains.

The Rwenzori Mountains National Park was gazetted as such by the government of Uganda in 1991 and has been listed as an important UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1994. Covering almost 1,000 square kilometers over its entire length of 220 kilometers, the mythical Mountains of the Moon are higher than the Alps and feature the third highest mountain in Africa, Margherita Peak on Mount Stanley, with a height of 5,109 meters. Located in southwestern Uganda along the border with the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), and with 70 percent of its area above an altitude of 2,500 meters, Africa's fourth and fifth-highest peaks (Mount Speke and Mount Baker) can also be found in the Rwenzori mountains.

In principle, the mountain range facilitates five vegetation zones, from grasslands in the foothills, montane and bamboo forests, and a heather zone on the lower elevations, with a moorland zone just below the snowfields and glaciers of the higher elevations. The flora of the moorland zone, fringed with swamps and rivers, is unique to equatorial alpine regions where some of the montane plant species, such as lobelia and groundsel, grow extraordinarily large, providing for surreal landscapes and 'out of this world' hiking experiences.

Encountering fauna in the park varies by elevation and includes wild-life typically found in the Albertine Rift Valley, such as 90 species of tropical birds, including the unique Rwenzori turaco, 18 species of butterflies, and a range of other wildlife, such as the forest elephant, chimpanzee, and the black and white colobus monkey.

Other activity options in Rwenzori Mountains National Park and their respective cost factor are as follows:

Activity Option - Climbing Rwenzori Mountains - US \$ 2,200 Per Person

Our trusted partner for climbing adventures in the Rwenzori Mountains National Park is the Rwenzori Trekking Service (RTS), whose shortest tour is an 8-day climb of the main 'Kilembe Circuit' to conquer the tallest peak, Margherita (5,109 meters) on Mount Stanley. Margherita is Africa's third-highest peak, and the Kilembe route allows you to see the wildlife wonders of the park as you proceed on your climb. RTS will provide all the equipment necessary for the climb, like crampons, ropes, harnesses, and carabiners; you must bring good hiking boots, warm clothing, a warm sleeping bag, and rain gear. RTS will rent sleeping bags and crampons for those who require them. For the higher elevations of the mountain, RTS now recommends that climbers have technical knowledge of ropes, crampons, ascenders, and how to use an ice axe since many ice sections now feature 60% steepness due to rapid changes occurring as a result of global warming.

Activity Option - Hiking Rwenzori Mountains - US \$ 400 Per Person

Our trusted partner for climbing adventures in the Rwenzori Mountains National Park is the Rwenzori Trekking Service (RTS), which offers short hiking sessions in the lower elevations. The 2-day version of this hike takes you from the Trekkers Hostel Kyanjuki to the Sine Camp at 2,596 meters, with an altitude gain ranging from 1,450 to 2,596 meters and a distance of about 10 kilometers covered. Your trekking time for the day will be 7 to 8 hours. At Sine Camp, the Rwenzori Trekking Services (RTS) operates wooden huts set between tall forest trees on a narrow ridge. Enjoy the fantastic views while watching a long set of rapids and a waterfall crashing over the rocks below. On your return to the park entrance the next day, you will hear the calls of the Rwenzori Turaco nesting in the Giant Heathers, which are abundant in this area.

Day 03 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Transfer from your accommodation to Kilembe Base Camp at 1,450 meters. After a meeting and briefing with climbing guides and porters, you proceed to your first climbing session, which will take you to the Sine Camp at 2,596 meters. The overall climbing gain for this day will be 1,146 meters.

Day 04 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Today's climbing session takes you to Mutinda Camp at 3,688 meters, with an overall climbing gain of 1,092 meters. Time permitting, you can also try to climb your first excursion to reach the Mutinda Lookout at 3,975 meters, where you can enjoy amazing views of the lands below the mountain range.

Mountain Accommodation Mountain Cabins

Day 05 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Today's climbing session takes you to the Bugata Camp at 4,100 meters and an overall climbing gain of 412 meters. The limited height gain is due to the steep ridges, muddy sections, and high steps. This climb will also take you through a valley of unique montane plant species, mountain streams, and waterfalls.

Day 06 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Toady's climbing session requires lateral trekking to reach Hunwick's



Camp at 3,974 meters. On your way, you will pass through the Bamwanjara Pass at 4,450 meters, offering fantastic views of all the main peaks.

☐ Day 07 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Today's climbing session takes you to Margherita Camp at 4,485 meters by first passing down and across the valley of Lake Kitandara, with its beautiful high-altitude flora and vast moorland fringed with swamps and rivers. On your way to Margherita Camp, you will also pass through Scott Elliot Pass.

Mountain Accommodation Mountain Cabins

Day 08 - Rwenzori Mountains National Park.

Today's climb will be the longest and is the ultimate highlight of your mountain adventure. Starting at two in the morning for an early breakfast, you set off to climb Mount Stanley across various glaciers to reach the summit of Margherita Peak at 5,109 meters. After reaching the summit, you descend to Hunwick's Camp at 3,974 meters for the night.

Today's venture is a further descent to the Kiharo Camp at 3,640 meters, passing through Oliver's Pass along the way.

The final descent of your mountain adventure takes you past moun-

tain rivers fringed with moss-covered rocks and beautiful mountain forests back to the Kilembe Base Camp at 1,450 meters. From there, you transfer to Kasese town for dinner/overnight at your chosen hotel.

BOOKING TERMS

Trekking With Rwenzori Trekking Services (RTS)

Mountain Guides: RTS has trained guides with extensive experience in high and low altitude climbing/trekking, knowledge of flora and fauna, first aid, abseiling, and general house keeping/cooking.

Porters: RTS climbing/trekking tours come with porters who will be carrying your luggage during the hike to a maximum weight of 23 kg per bag. It is advisable that you carry a large backpack, which the porters will be carrying for you and a day pack for your personal equipment which you will carry yourself. Backpack covers are a must have as the Rwenzoris are always wet even in dry seasons. RTS provides 2 porters per client, one for the main luggage and the other takes care of food supplies. Additional porters can be hired at an extra fee of US \$ 15 per day.

Meals: RTS prides itself in providing good food on all their mountain treks and their guides are trained to do the preparation and cooking. Meals are designed to keep you healthy throughout your trek and RTS will be happy to receive information about special food requirements or allergies. Please note that RTS does not supply bottled water on their treks as all water is purified from streams. It is therefore advisable that climbers carry water purifiers to cater for at least 3 liters a day. Boiled water is available for tea and coffee, so some climbers might chose to fill up their water bottles the night before with boiled water.

Accommodation: During the trek, mountain accommodation is available in huts with dormitory style bunk beds and mattresses. Unfortunately RTS cannot provide twin or single beds during the hike as the conditions of building mountain huts are tough, combined with our policy of maintaining a low environmental footprint. All major huts have wood stoves and hence provide for cosy interiors. In addition, Hunwick's and Kiharo camps have solar power connected to inverters providing 240 Volt power.

Insurance: RTS requires a mandatory insurance before arrival covering Medivac and evacuation services at an altitude of 4,000 meters and above. Please note that no trek shall depart without insurance coverage for all participants in place. In addition, all RTS huts are equipped with stretchers and RTS trekking teams are equipped with a first aid box and a satellite telephone. Other emergency procedures are in place and climbers will be briefed in detail before departing on their trek/climb.

Gear & Equipment: For all treks summiting Margherita peak, RTS will provide the following gear: harnesses, carabiners, ice axes, helmets, rubber boots, ropes and ice screws as part of the hiking package. Other equipment requirements must be catered for by all climbers. Please do carry your own pair of crampons if possible, although these can be hired from RTS at a cost of US \$ 20. Below is a list of gear and equipment you need to carry though you can adjust the lists to fit in more equipment which may make your hike more comfortable.



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Low Altitude Trekking

Essential Low Altitude Clothing:

Summer shirts and shorts for hotter low altitudes.

Warm long sleeved shirt for colder high altitudes.

Warm long walking trousers, not jeans.

Fleece jacket and/or a down jacket for additional warmth.

Alternatively a warm anorak jacket which should not be too heavy.

Cheap plastic poncho or rain jacket.

A warm hat and a sun hat, preferably one that has both a beak and shades at the back.

Two pairs of gloves, one pair of thin liners and another of warmer material.

Essential Low Altitude Footwear:

Hiking shoes of good quality and well-worn in.

Good trainers can also work for a few days.

Walking shoes of lighter weight or trainers for the start of the climb (Optional).

Several pairs of warm, cushioned socks so you always have a dry pair to change into.

Rubber boots for children. RTS provides these to adults free of charge.

Essential Low Altitude Equipment:

Good quality sleeping bag with a minimum rating of 4 seasons.

Soft bag/hold all or rucksack, framed or unframed and large enough to hold your personal gear on the mountain. This will be carried by a porter.

Day sac with a minimum capacity of 8 kg that you will carry.

This should be big enough for you to carry your daily water ration of 3 liters, a lunch box, camera, wet weather clothing and fleece jacket. External protective cover for rucksack & day sac.

Alternatively you can pack all contents in plastic bags for water-proofing.

Lip salve and sunglasses.

Head Torch or normal torch and a set of spare batteries.

Special batteries are not always available locally.

Strong water bottle(s) to hold 3 liters which you will carry with you daily.

Water treatment tablets / iodine or quality filter.

Water will be boiled for you by our staff and served as tea or coffee.

Spare plastic bags to keep things as dry as possible.

Wash kit plus a small towel.

Basic First Aid kit for personal use including paracetamol and dehydration sachets

A few of your favourite sweets/chewies/dried fruit.

Essential High Altitude Clothing:

Warm long sleeved shirt for colder high altitudes.

Fleece jacket and/or a down jacket for additional warmth.

Alternatively a warm anorak jacket which should not be too heavy.

Thermal underwear.

Good quality waterproof and windproof outer shell consisting of jacket & trousers.

Cheap plastic poncho or rain jacket.

A warm hat and a sun hat, preferably one that has both a beak and shades at the back.

Wool hat or Balaclava.

Two pairs of gloves, one pair of thin liners and another warmer and waterproof outer gloves.

Essential High Altitude Footwear:

Mountain boots of good quality and well-worn in.

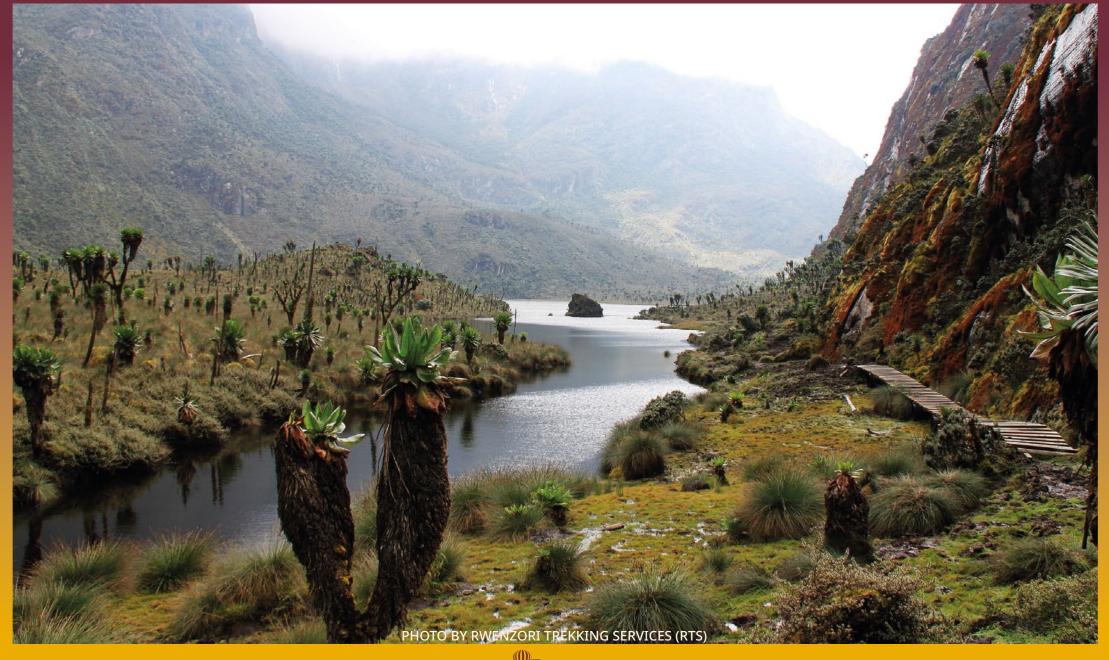
Walking shoes of lighter weight or trainers for the start of the climb (Optional).

Several pairs of warm, cushioned socks so you always have a dry pair to change into.

Crampons for the summit day. Please do carry a pair of your own crampons.

Kindly note that crampons are a must have for the summit climb to Margherita peak.







Essential High Altitude Equipment:

Good quality sleeping bag with a minimum rating of 4 seasons. Soft bag/hold all or rucksack, framed or unframed and large enough to hold your personal gear on the mountain. This will be carried by a porter.

Day sac with a minimum capacity of 8 kg that you will carry.

This should be big enough for you to carry your daily water ration of 3 liters, a lunch box, camera, wet weather clothing and fleece jacket. External protective cover for rucksack & day sac.

Alternatively you can pack all contents in plastic bags for water-proofing.

Lip salve and sunglasses preferably models with side shields.

Head Torch or normal torch and a set of spare batteries.

Special batteries are not always available locally.

Back up torch and spare batteries.

Strong water bottle(s) to hold 3 liters which you will carry with you daily.

Water treatment tablets / iodine or quality filter.

Water will be boiled for you by our staff and served as tea or coffee. Spare plastic bags to keep things as dry as possible.

Wash kit plus a small towel.

Basic First Aid kit for personal use including paracetamol and dehydration sachets. A few of your favourite sweets/chewies/dried fruit.

- A baggage restriction of 15 kg in soft-sided bags applies to chartered flights within East Africa.
